

## World Series 13, Plages du Prado Gaston Defferre, Marseille, France, July 20-25

Updated on **July 14, 2010**, this fact sheet provides information on the FIVB and the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**. The US\$6.83-million **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** is scheduled over an eight-month period starting in April in Brazil and ending in November in Thailand. The US\$380,000 **World Series 13** is the ninth men's event on the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar. The **2010 World Series 13** will mark the 16th season that a men's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** stop has been held in Marseille, the site of the most international Beach Volleyball events since the start of the circuit in 1987. Rio de Janeiro is second on the list with 14 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** tournaments, but none have been held on its "world famous" beaches since 2004. The women have been competing in Marseille every year since 1997, except in 2005 when the promoter was organizing a men's and women's stop in Paris.

- The **World Series 13** will be the 252nd men's event on the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** (open, grand slam, Olympic and Goodwill). The first men's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event was played February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
- After the Marseille stop, the season's final **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** Grand Slam stops will be held in Austria (Klagenfurt, July 26-August 1) and Poland (Stare Jablonki, August 2-8). Open events will conclude the European portion of the international season with stops in Norway (Kristiansand, August 9-15), Finland (Åland, August 16-22) and The Netherlands (The Hague, August 23-29). The 14-event men's international schedule ends in The Hague. The 15-stop women's calendar concludes during the last week in October in China (Sanya, October 26-31) and the first week of November in Thailand (Phuket, November 2-7).

- **About the FIVB** - The Fédération Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB) is the governing body responsible for all forms of Volleyball and Beach Volleyball on a global level. Working closely with the National Federations and private enterprises, the FIVB promotes Volleyball and Beach Volleyball competitions and development activities as entertainment and promotional factors for the enjoyment of spectators and participants while satisfying sponsors' needs. It aims to develop Volleyball and Beach Volleyball as a major world media and entertainment sport through world-class planning and organization of competitions, marketing and promotional activities. The FIVB is part of the Olympic Movement, contributing to the success of the Olympic Games.

- The television coverage for the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** will feature 55 broadcast companies across the world. The coverage covers six macro-regions (Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America and the, Middle East) with IMG the FIVB's partner for TV distribution and production. A total of 134 "live" matches and 21 highlight programs have been and will be produced and distributed throughout the season offering increased access to each **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event. The 2009 international Beach Volleyball season saw an increase in international broadcasters from 24 in 2008 to 39 in 2009 when more than 1,600 total hours of primary footage of events were broadcast around the world.

**MEN'S UPDATE** - After two weeks of Grand Slam Beach Volleyball competition on Norwegian docks and in the Swiss Alps, the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** will be idle before resuming competition July 19-25 in the Mediterranean port city of Marseille for a men's and women's "Open" play. Beach Volleyball pairs from Brazil (four medals), China (1), Germany (3), Norway (1) and the United States (3) have shared the podium placements the past two weeks in Stavanger and Gstaad as \$1.2-million was distributed during the third and fourth "major" events on the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar. While Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa Franca of Brazil captured both women's gold medals in Norway and Switzerland, David Klemperer and Eric Koreng played in both title matches as the Germans topped the podium in Stavanger and placed second to American Olympic champions Phil Dalhausser and Todd Rogers in Gstaad. Dalhausser and Rogers's 5,180 points for eight men's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** this season has earned the Americans a commanding 1,520-point lead over Brazilians Alison Cerutti and Emanuel Rego of Brazil (3,660 points), who have placed fifth and 17th the last two weeks in Norway and Switzerland, respectively. Dalhausser and Rogers have placed in the "final four" at each event this season with five gold medal finishes. Klemperer and Koreng's back-to-back gold medal appearances have moved the Germans into the No. 5 spot on the points list ahead behind Spain's Adrian Gavira/Pablo Herrera (3,440 points) and compatriots Julius Brink/Jonas Reckermann (3,000), the defending **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** champions. Brink and Reckermann are currently sidelined with left knee injuries after playing in the first six events this season.

- A new Mikasa ball, the VLS 300, will be used after being introduced at 2009 season-ending events in Sanya and Phuket.
