

## Guidelines for Referee's Digital Photo

At each 2010 Swatch-FIVB World Tour event the concerned Referee Delegate is responsible to coordinate the collection of digital head-and-shoulder shots from International Beach Volleyball referees and Candidates, plus dynamic action shots from refereeing personnel in general.

The photos are to be taken by the Official Photographer on-site at specific established timings and during matches. Arrangements should be made in order to avoid that the photographer might be distracted from his/her other duties.

Portrait pictures to be taken with the same consistent background, with referees duly uniformed while not wearing sweatshirts, sunglasses, caps, etc. Below you may find the general guidelines in order to get the best quality picture to be posted at the Database:

- 1- **The file must be a Jpeg format**
- 2- **The picture must be taken in a Portrait mode at the maximum resolution possible by the Photographer's digital camera. The portrait mode is like the one on the left and NOT IN LANDSCAPE mode like the one on the right. This is very important**



- 3- **The picture should be taken from a close angle from the shoulder to the head, like the picture on the left**
- 4- **For the photo purpose the Referee must be dress in official uniform, including the FIVB Ref Badge, and without sunglasses and caps**
- 5- **The name of the referee (last name only) should identify the file**
- 6- **For the actions shots, please give to the Official Photographer a summary of scenarios that you may look for (i.e.: BMP, coin toss, etc)**

Following the completion of this task by the Official Photographer, the Referee Delegate is responsible for collecting all digital photos, "Zipping" into one file and then copying them either to:
